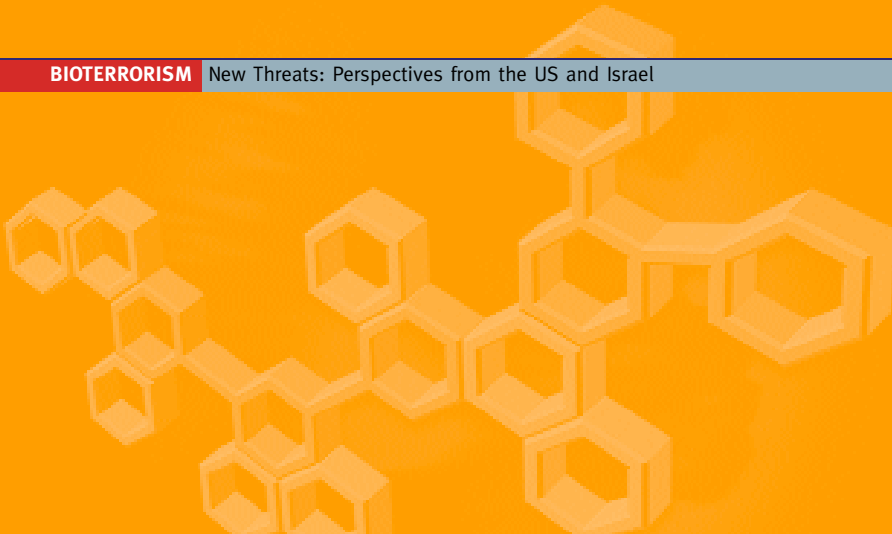

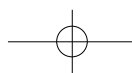

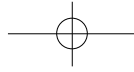
New Threats: Perspectives from the US and Israel
